Swiss to Have National Park.

It is proposed to reserve this for park purposes, and as the region has legendary and historic associations of great national interest, the people generally favor the plan.

NOTED MAN PASSES

Higginson Was Historian, Author, Clergyman and Soldier.

Famous American Who Was Active in Many Lines Leaves Enduring Works to Perpetuate His Name.

Cambridge, Mass.—In the death of Col. Thomas Wentworth Higginson, which took place here in his 87th year, there passes one of the country's most noted men. Historian, author, clergyman, soldier and abolitionist, he was active in many lines and leaves enduring works to perpetuate his name.

Col. Higginson was a student under Longfellow, a neighbor of Oliver Wendell Holmes, a college mate of Edward Everett Hale and friend of Emerson, Whittier and Longfellow. As essayist, historian, biographer and writer for the young, he made for himself an unusual place in American literature. Though the author of a volume verse, he never claimed place as a poet, modestly entitling this work "Such as They Are."

Col. Higginson was born in Cambridge, Mass., in 1823 and graduated from Harvard in 1841. In 1847 he graduated from the Divinity school in Cambridge and the same year was ordained pastor of the First Congregational Church at Newburyport, Mass. He left this church in 1850 because of the unpopularity of his anti-slavery teachings, and in the same year stood unsuccessfully as the Free Soil candidate for congress. He then became pastor of a church in Worcester, Mass., from 1852 to 1858. Leaving his charge in the latter year he devoted himself to literature and his anti-slavery agitation. For his part in the attempted rescue of Anthony Burns, a famous incident in the anti-slavery days, he was indicted for murder, together with Theodore Parker, Wendell Phillips and others, but



was released on account of a flaw in the legal papers. He also took part in organizing parties of free-state emigrants to Kansas in 1854 and served as brigadier general in James H. Lane's forces in that state organized to drive out the Missouri invaders.

Mr. Higginson was made captain in the Forty-first Massachusetts regiment in 1862; in the same year he was made colonel of a regiment of colored troops, the First South Carolina Volunteers, afterward known as the Thirty-third United States Colored Troops, the first regiment of freed slaves mustered into service. Higginson saw considerable active service in the war. He took and held Jacksonville, Fla.; at Wilton Bluff he was wounded, in August, 1863, and in October of the next year resigned on account of disability. He then went to Newport, R. I., to live, engaging in literature, and afterwards to Cambridge. He was a member of the Massachusetts legislature in 1880 and 1881, serving as chief of staff to the governor at the same time. In 1884 he was a member of the State Board of Education.

He was a fellow of the American Academy of Political Science and a member of the American Historical Society, the American Antiquarian Society, the New England Historic-Geographical Society, the Military Historical Society, the Royal Legion and the Grand Army of the Republic. He had been president of the Harvard Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa. Some years ago he received the degree of doctor of laws from Western Reserve university and in 1898 received the same degree from Harvard.

THE ELECTRICAL HEN NEXT

Simple Device Attached to an Incubator Gives Astonishing Results to a Washington Farmer.

Tacoma, Wash.—Sixty-nine healthy chicks from a setting of 73 eggs have just been hatched by electricity on J. Don Alexander's ranch at Reitmeler's Station, Wash. The initial test was so successful that 1,500 eggs will be placed in the incubators as soon as the apparatus can be installed. The equipment, which is not patented, can be attached to any oil-burning incubator at an expense of less than one dollar.

Construction of the electrically operated incubator is simple. Mr. Alexander took the lamps from the oil-burning machines and wound German silver wire around the frames above the egg trays, connecting the coils with an incandescent light circuit. This is made through a contact device consisting of a piece of iron fixed on the regulator arm to dip into a small cup filled with mercury.

When the temperature in the incubator rises to 103 degrees, the natural matching point, the iron arm is lifted automatically, shutting off the current until there is a fall of one-fourth degree.

ROYALTY AMID CORONATION

Officials From All Nations Fill Staid London.

King and Queen Ready for Festivities. John Hays Hammond of U. S. on Hand.

Events of Week at Coronation of King and Queen.

June 18 and 19—The royal representatives from foreign nations arrive.

June 20—Special envoys and delegates are received by the king and queen. State banquet at Buckingham palace.

June 21—Reception by their majesties of the over-sea premiers and representatives. Day of special intercession for the king and nation. The Duke of Connaught gives a dinner at St. James palace.

June 22—Coronation day.

June 23—Royal progress through South London.

London—The Earl Marshal, the Duke of Norfolk, and the Lord Chamberlain, the Earl Spencer, are busy men and much sought after in these days immediately preceding the coronation. They are custodians of the elect, sorters of social aspirants, inquirers into pretensions of rank in these trying times of pomp and circumstance. Whoever has failed to satisfy the bluff, black-bearded Earl Marshal in the tweed jacket before then certainly will receive the illuminated cardboard inviting them to be present at the Abbey where they may see not merely the crowning, but also the Earl Marshal himself, trying to look as pleased with his gorgeous trappings as a simple man can be expected to do.

Between now and July 1 there will be a round of engagements. Premier and Mrs. Asquith will give a dinner to their majesties in Downing street, June 20. The entertainment will include the presenting of two plays, Bernard Shaw's "The Man of Destiny" and James A. Barrie's "The Twelve-Pound Look."

Sir Edward Grey, the foreign minister, gave a dinner in honor of the king and queen at the foreign office, June 23, which was one of the most brilliant of the season. There were 150 guests at the dinner, including all the foreign princes and envoys to the coronation.

A noteworthy feature along the lines of route to be followed by the newly crowned king, in his procession through the streets of London, is the most complete transformation of familiar sights. Churches, ancient edifices, public buildings and open spaces, business premises and private residences have entirely changed their appearance. Starting with the Westminster Abbey itself, the coronation route is a series of almost alarmingly, although efforts were exerted to lend an air of age to the stucco addition.

The office of works has decided to permit those present to purchase, as souvenirs, the chairs and stools on which they sat, all of which are marked with the word "Coronation," and embossed with the crown and the date of the occurrence.

A peculiar dilemma which arose out of the scarcity of first-class carriages for the coronation, since the universal introduction of the motor car, affected many members of the peerage. To avoid the terrible consequences of possible rushes into the main thoroughfares from side streets, barriers of timber were erected at the most dangerous street junctions.

John Hays Hammond, special ambassador of the United States, made his official entry into the city at noon Monday, arriving from the country.

He was met at the Victoria station by the Duke of Connaught, representing King George, and other officials and the staff, consisting of Baron Sandhurst, Lieutenant-Colonel Bernard N. James and Captain C. F. G. Sowerby, especially appointed to attend the American envoy throughout his mission.

Ambassador Whitelaw Reid, who has been ill at his country place during the last week, is greatly improved and attending the festivities.

"Liberals" Under Indictment.

Los Angeles—Ricardo Flores Magon, head of the liberal or Mexican social revolutionary junta in this city, was arrested on a federal indictment charging him with having violated the neutrality laws of the United States. At the same time, United States Marshal Leo Youngworth took into custody Angelino Figueroa and Librado Rivera, associates of Magon, against whom similar indictments were returned. Figueroa is editor of the revolutionary paper, Regeneracion.

Sarah Goes Home Happy.

New York—Sarah Bernhardt has completed a tour of 25,000 miles, visited 103 American cities, given 285 performances, won nearly \$1,000,000 from theater-goers, and lost 15 pounds. Quite a little jaunt for a woman of 67. "It has all been wonderful. My success has been greater than ever before. Last time it was sad. It was good-bye; but this time your people were surprised. They looked and listened. They said: 'The same beauty, the same voice, the same Sarah.' The people were glad and I was glad and I am happy."

Undersea Record Broken.

Gloucester—American records for submerged runs were broken by the flotilla of seven submarines which arrived from Newport. All of the number stayed under water 10 hours during the run from Nantucket to Provincetown, while two of the number did not come to the surface for 11 hours. This is the longest time any submarine of the U. S. Navy has ever remained beneath the surface.

Rope Skipping Fatal to Child.

Pittsburg—Otilia Danner, aged 6, died at her home in St. Clair borough, the result of a ruptured blood vessel, caused by jumping the rope.
