Portland, Or., Sept. 7, (Special) Steps have been taken by Central Oregon people to exploit one of the greatest resources of the region that has heretofore been neglected. This is the useful at the Hawaian Islands, Guan, horse. To stimulate breeding of fine animals, the Central Oregon Livestock Sales Association has been formed, with headquarters at Redmond, and hereafter sales of horses will be held on the third Monday of each month at that point.

The object is to establish a big horse market, where breeders will come in touch with buyers and find fair prices for their stock. The organization is not for the benefit of Redmond alone, nor is it intended for the profit of association members, but it will help every section and community of Central Oregon, even to the rancher in the foothills.

The outside buyer, it is b leved, will come to a sale where he can pick from a bunch of 400 or 500 head, when if he has to travel from ranch to ranch, he is not attracted. All classes of horses, from bronchos to the finest riding and draft horses, will be offered. Central Oregon has exploited its alfalfa, sheep, wool and cattle, and but little has been said about its horses. Yet it produces thousands of fine animals, climate and all conditions being favorable to the best development of the horse, and the new plan will probably add to the importance of the industry.

Burned Out.

Fire destroyed the ranch house on the Thomas place, about eight miles south of Mosier, on Thursday evening of last week. The house was occupied by E. C. Brock, who was superintending the place for a company that bought it last year.

The fire is supposed to have been started from an overheated stove in the kitchen while Mr. Brock and a friend had gone to a neighbor's on an errand. When they returned it had gained such headway that nothing could be done to save the building, so the men confined their labors to getting out what furniture they could. Only a small part of the contents could be removed, however, the most of it being destroyed with the house. Mr. Brock estimates the entire loss at about \$3,000, with
