MAKE MONEY WITH CHICKENS
However, One Must Understand Every Requirement to Get Most Out of Flock—Start With Few.

Success or failure with chickens rests with the operator alone, writes C. N. Whittaker of Lawrence, Mich., in the Chicago Daily News. To get the most out of his hens one must understand and be ready to meet their every requirement. He must be able to keep them in first-class physical condition, he must know just how much to feed and the kind of food that constitutes the best ration. Nothing can be left to chance or guesswork. Ignorance or indifference means failure.

There is good money in poultry and Chicago is a good market. Last year our Rhode Island Red hens cost us about \$1.20 each for feed, and the return from them was a little less than \$3 each. This is not a small farm flock, as we keep several hundred, and even now when they are all yarded to keep them out of a crop of buckwheat, growing on their range, and are in the middle of the molting season, they are paying a profit of 8 to 10 cents each a month.

A man came to Michigan about a year ago. His ignorance was colossal, his conceit stupendous. He had read "systems" until he exuded portions of them at every pore, and his plans were all made before he put a foot on his farm. He said he was going to make us sit up and take notice. He did. Owing to the improper ventilation of his poultry house he lost half his hens during the winter, and he did not get to exceed two dozen eggs through November, December and January. About the middle of August his son said: "We got an egg yesterday, the first one we have had in over two months." Success with chickens under such conditions is impossible.

There is certainly money in poultry, but to get it out a man must be willing to learn the things he does not know. The best way to do this is to start with a few fowls and let the number increase with his experience.

FEW LITTLE ORCHARD HELPS
Trees Respond to Application of Manure as Quickly as Any Other Crop—Better Plowed Under.

When the mercury hovers around the small figures and the snow is on the ground, there is a job waiting for you.

Haul a little manure into the orchard. And little, as used in this connection, means a good deal. For an orchard twelve or fifteen years planted, a two-horse wagon load will not be too much for two trees. Trees respond to the application of manure as quickly as any other crop. And anything which increases the vigor and health of the trees adds to their ability to produce fruit.

For young orchards upon rich prairie soil, manure is not advised, but after ten years of growth, the soil needs reinforcement. It was formerly taught as a cardinal principle that a new tree should never be planted where an old one has been removed. But practical men no longer regard this view. They make the old spot rich with fertilizers and plant the trees there just the same. And the tree blooms just as well as any well-planted tree should.

Successful fruit men do not pasture their orchards, neither do they cut and remove crops of hay. Everything which grows upon the surface is returned to the soil.

In the application of manure never pile it about the body of the tree, but spread it out over a surface as large as the spread of the tops. In many cases this will mean covering the whole surface. If you can plow it under when spring comes, that is better. But if you cannot do this, much of the nutriment will get down to the roots, through the medium of the spring rains.

If your fruit is poor and small, it is not fair to lay it to the depravity of the tree, or the insect every time, for often it is the lack of fertility which causes failure. Help the tree to do its work by feeding it liberally.

Phosphate Rock.
Phosphate rock is the great American fertilizer. It is about the only natural raw material that has yet been found in great quantities in this country, and its abundance has led to rapid development of the mines, leading to a production of 2,555,000 tons in the past year. The average price during the year declined from \$4.62 to \$4.11 per ton. Most of the deposits are in the south, but there is a great deal of phosphate land in the west. An effort is being made to encourage the use of raw phosphate rock, finely ground. It is claimed that this material, low price considered, is superior to the acid phosphate, because, although it acts more slowly, the effect is more lasting. Experiments indicate that the raw rock will be found adapted to such uses as top dressing and mowing lands and for use in orchards and vineyards, also for general improvement of poor soils.

Favorite Cholera Cure.
A favorite cholera cure in the west is made as follows: Red pepper, two ounces; powdered asafoetida, two ounces; carbonate of iron, four ounces; powdered rhubarb, one ounce; Spanish brown, six ounces; sulphur, two ounces. The mixture is made into pellets with flour and water and given three times a day. The mixed powder is added to the soft food as a preventive, giving a tablespoonful twice a week to every two dozen fowls.

Calves and Cows.
If you want to make a veritable milk-producing machine of a cow and have her worry as little as possible never permit her to "mother" her calf. Take it away from her as soon as possible, for if she has time to become strongly attached to it she is sure to worry when it is finally taken away from her. If the first two or three calves are thus removed the maternal instinct is likely to become largely dormant, and she will come to consider a calf rather than a calf as the natural channel for her milk.

Ink Spots.
These troublesome stains may be removed by an application of equal parts of citric acid and cream of tartar melted on a plate. Mix and rub over the stains and then wash out carefully. In almost all cases the ink will disappear at once without injury to the color. Stains that have been laundered may require several treatments before they yield.—Woman's Home Companion.

WRIGHTS' GLIDER GREAT SUCCESS

Aeroplane Inventor Is Satisfied With Experiments.

Most Efficient Machine Yet Made—Addition of Motor Will Render Flying Safe.

Dayton, O.—The Wright Brothers, aeroplane inventors and aviators, are highly gratified with the results of their recent experiments with their new glider at Kitty Hawk, N. C. They believe that the experiments conducted there will have a vital influence on the future of aerial transportation.

The climax of the plodding, painstaking tests occurred when Orville Wright caused his motorless biplane to hover over a spot only 15 feet in diameter for more than 10 minutes.

"Our experiments have been very satisfactory," said Orville Wright, discussing his flight. "They have far beyond my expectations. I went to Kitty Hawk simply to carry out some ideas I had worked out here at home concerning gliding machines. As a matter of fact I was not very optimistic about extensive success. But after I had rearranged a number of details, I succeeded in keeping the craft in the air for such a long period. Our success is due to the fact that the craft is exceptionally efficient. By efficiency, I mean that all its parts are balanced so as to make a perfect lifting vehicle.

"When an aviator speaks of efficiency, he means the capability of an aeroplane to fly with the least amount of motive power. He has in mind the soaring qualities of an aeroplane. I can truly say that our craft is enormously efficient. I don't mean to claim that we can fly without power, but I do mean that our machine can fly with less power than any other.

"Under certain conditions I am certain that the ideas we have developed during the past few weeks would enable us to build a machine which would fly even with less horse power. I know that we could fly for an hour without power, given proper atmospheric conditions, and I see no reason why we cannot fly for 10 hours if we have a question of the time, the place, the wind and the machine.

"In order to make extensive powerful flights, however, the craft would have to be built more strongly. At the present time such construction is now economical. Owing to the state of the skill of aviators it would cost them too much to pay for the frequent breakage of an expensive craft.

"But I don't wish to give the impression that I think the present machine in use is defective. It is my opinion that our late type of biplanes is about as good as any craft will be for many years to come. It flies with less power than any craft in existence; it is strong and durable, and it is susceptible of almost perfect control. When some of the things I have discovered here are incorporated in the craft, I don't think it will easily be surpassed.

"I do think that the future of the aeroplane depends to a certain extent upon the future of the motor. No motor that I want to say that the present motor is lacking in any serious manner. I think the motor of the present is just as perfect as the machine. But I do believe that, with natural evolution, motors will be made to deliver more power and will be built more compactly."

Canal Food Vindicated.
Washington, D. C.—A careful investigation made by a board of physicians on the Isthmus of Panama has demonstrated that the food furnished to the hotels, messes and employes in the canal zone is of such quantity, quality and variety as to meet, and even exceed, the highest standards prescribed by the tropics.

The board was appointed to determine whether the present ration is suitable for workmen. One physician maintained that the food furnished caused stomach and liver diseases.

Ship Found Under City.
San Francisco—Unearthed from its sleep of 60 years or more beneath the bustle and rush of the commission district of this city, the skeleton of a deep water ship, built more than a century ago, was disclosed by workmen excavating for a building. The massive timbers of the old sea rover, held together with hand-wrought copper spikes, lie within almost a stone's throw of the side of Fort Gunnybags, where the vigilantes exacted swift justice in pioneer days, and nearly half a mile from the present waterfront.

German Spy Convicted.
Exeter, England—Lieutenant Philip M. Schultz, of the Thirtieth Hussars, stationed at Frankfurt-on-the-Main, was convicted at the Devonshire assizes on the charge of spying, and sentenced to 21 months' imprisonment. It was alleged by the prosecution that Lieutenant Schultz was commissioned by the German authorities to discover how far the British government was supporting France in the dispute over Morocco.

Sympathy Strike Called.
Kansas City—Orders have been issued from the headquarters of the International Boilermakers' union in Kansas City, Kan., for 400 boilermakers on four New York Central lines to quit work. The strike is in sympathy with that of 1,600 other boilermakers who laid down their tools February 20, when piecework was installed on four Eastern roads.

Kaiser Gets Congo.
Paris—The contents of the Franco-German accord, officially given out, show that Germany recognizes the right of France to establish a protectorate in Morocco, while both nations engage to obtain the adherence to this accord of the other signatories to the Algeiras agreement.

was Misunderstood.
A Russian, who, although he has been some time in Paris, knows little or nothing of the French language, has just been sentenced to a month's imprisonment for having assaulted a policeman. He had also been accused of having insulted the agent of the law, but he was acquitted on that count after an explanation from his counsel that the word which the policeman regarded as objectionable was also a Russian word, and perfectly innocent.
