

Oats, or any preferred crop may be sowed and the rack with netting placed over it when of suitable size and the fowls then turned loose. They seem to delight in walking about on the netting and snipping off the green blades within reach. Yet, they cannot get at the roots to scratch and the plants have a chance to renew their growth thus pruned off, and the fowls are continually adding fertilizing material. 


