CAUSE OF SCOURS IN CALVES

To Prevent and Overcome Disease Medicines Should be Given to Avoid Fermentation of Food.

Scours in calves or calf cholera in many instances differ from diarrhoea in grown animals, and has special features of its own, taking the form of infectious intestinal catarrh which is far more serious than the diarrhoea of the full grown animal.

Scours in calves generally appear suddenly. A perfectly healthy calf may be seized all at once, apparently without any change in food or care.

The symptoms of this infantile diarrhoea usually appear during the first two or three weeks of life.

In many cases scours appear within a few hours after the animal is born, and the calf may die within from twenty-four hours unless it receives prompt and proper treatment.

It is common for the calf to be afflicted with scours immediately at birth, even before it has had time to suck or take any nourishment whatever.

The faeces of manure is very thin and watery. It has sour disagreeable odor and is usually light colored. The evacuations are frequent and expelled with force.

The first indication of scours is the soiled condition of the tail, loss of appetite, sunken eyes, sometimes the saliva flowing from the mouth, no attempt being made to swallow.

They have a staring coat, grow thin, and lose strength rapidly.

Death usually follows in from twelve to twenty-four hours unless prompt measures are taken to check the disease.

To prevent and overcome scours in calves, they should be given medicines that prevent fermentation of food to allay irritation and congestion, soothe and heal inflamed mucous membrane, act as an antiseptic, as this is quite necessary when the disease is due to a germ.

MANY DEAD IN MINE DISASTER

Tennessee Coal Mine Wrecked By Dust Explosion.

Over Two Miles of Tunnels Wrecked—Day Shift Had Just Gone On—Bodies Found.

Brieville, Tenn.—Somewhere in the depths of Cross Mountain coal mine probably 100 men lie dead while their sorrow-stricken families keep vigil at the mouth of their loved ones may be alive when rescuers reach them.

Eight mangled bodies were brought forth by nightfall, when search was abandoned for the day. Except for the immediate families of the entombed men, no one in this little mountain village believes that any living thing in the mine has survived the terrific explosion of coal dust that wrecked the workings Saturday morning.

Seven dead men discovered sitting upright in a train of nine cars in Cross entry No. 24, two miles from the mouth of the mine brought the list of known dead from the explosion to 16.
