The new steel bridge over the Deschutes river at Maupin is now ready for traffic, says the Shaniko Star. Quoting County Commissioner H. S. Rooper, that gentleman said:

"The bridge is a handsome and substantial structure," and is a good investment for the county, even though its cost exceeds by about \$4000 the original estimate. The extra cost was due to encountering a large deposit of quicksand where the engineers expected to secure a bedrock foundation, necessitating a great deal of concrete work. The steel part of the bridge cost \$10,500, while the extra concrete, approaches and cost of supervision brings the total cost to something over \$16,000.
