

San Antonio, Tex.-Emiliano Vasquez Gomez has issued a manifesto ac-cepting the provisional presidency of

He subscribes to the plan of Tacubaya, which he says was writen while he was an exile in a foreign land. Gomez says he will remain in San Antonio and take no part in the war-

friends in America. He declares the Madero governent should be overthrown because it has not carried out the plan of San Luis Potosi, upon which the last revolution was based.

Mexico City-Notwithstanding their threat to attack the city before the end of the week, the rebels are yet regarding Torreon from a distance. Communication from that town by telegraph was restored and latest dispatches indicate no improvement in the revolutionary situation.

Private advices written four days ago are that the city is beginning to feel the effects of a siege. With railroads disabled, it is impossible to renew food supplies. Most of the Americans and many of the other foreigners have left.

It is not the rebel force the people of Torreon fear so much as the horde of individuals likely to take advantage of the rebels' assault. One man, in a letter, said that al-

ready there were camped about the place hundreds of Indians awaiting the day when they could join in the looting. The men had brought with them burros on which to carry off the

Rebels from various parts of the republic tell of rebel raids and small court. uprisings at distant points.

A body of rebels overpowered the small garrison of Apizaca, in the state of Tlaxcatla, relieved the soliders of their guns and ammunition and left without doing any looting. Other towns in the same state are reported to be menaced by the same band.




