Hood River Fighting Box. [Oregonian.] HOOD RIVER, Or., Feb. 25—(Special)—With the announcement that the House committee to which the Sulzer apple-box bill has been referred will listen to arguments of Northwestern growers March 8, Hood River growers are busy preparing evidence in an endeavor to show the harmful results that would issue if the bill becomes law.

Mr. Mason received a letter from C. E. Whisler, of Medford, who announced that he will leave for Washington next Wednesday. He will appear before the committee with the Hood River and Mosier boxes as well as boxes of fruit from Medford.

The Sulzer bill, while it is like the Lafean bill, which has appeared before Congress on former occasions, provides for a box of 10 more cubic inches than that of the Lafean bill. The Sulzer box measures 2352 cubic inches.

Mr. Whisler says in his letter that the Western growers were confident of success after presenting their packages. "We are going to fight the bill to a finish," he writes.
