orange blooms, Mr. Powell heard much talk among growers with a smattering of pomology about the influence of stock, soil, water, fogs, gravity and psychic influence on the keeping qualities of fruit. They were shown conclusively that the difference lay in the efficiency of the labor, the equipment and sanitary conditions of the packing houses, and so on. Truly, it is the little foxes that spoil the vines. The nail in the barrel or box, nearby piles of decayed fruit to scatter disease, gravel or twigs in the bottom of a picking box, the use of pointed instead of blunt clippers, the puncturing stem of a neighboring fruit, the sharp
