



Seedless Apples

The seedless apple has been discovered again, for perhaps the twentieth time. It is a Delaware man who comes to the front now with this inestimable boon. When we last heard of it, five or six years ago, it was heralded as the epoch-making product of a Electric Wisconsin investigator's genius and patient toil.

The seedless apple reappears regularly once in about 5 years. There are only two objections to it which we can think of. The first is that it is not seedless. The second is that it is not fit to eat. The only seedless apples we have ever seen had wellmarked seeds in the usual places and a perfectly perceptible core. But that was of little consequence. Seeds and a core are no particular drawback to an apple if it is otherwise desirable. But when the fruit is small and hard and bitter. the fact that its seeds are inconspicuous does not atone for its other defects. If a really seedless apple should be produced, it would not be worth while. If it were worth while we should have had it long ago. for it involves no insurmountable difficulty. All that an orchardist has to do to evolve a seedless annle is to select snecimens in which the seed exhibits a tendency to abort and pronagate from them. 
