The state committee has under way an exhibit showing how 75,000 boys and girls of the state have been interested in the new competitive gardening contests and how 10,000 Portland school children were enlisted in similar work in this city alone. Not wanting the fruit wasted, the owner shipped a bushel basket of the apples to a commission house in Portland, as an experiment. The house wrote him immediately that they would take all he had, and quoted a price. The man shipped the entire crop from the seven trees to Portland and received a check for \$245, or \$35 per tree.
