Ralph Duvall and sister Grace left yesterday morning for a fortnight's visit with their parents at Independence.

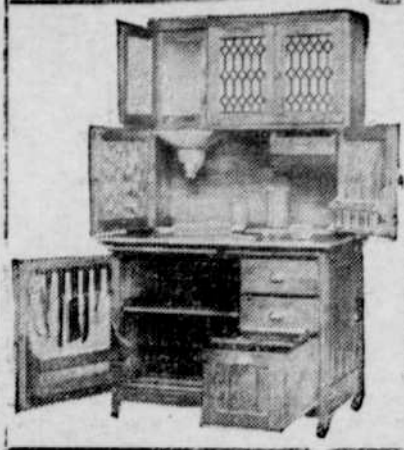
Mrs. T. W. DeBussey has moved into town from the ranch and is occupying the Marsh residence on Washington Street.
