C. M. Dickinson, a former Mosier resident, now living in Portland, spent last week on his homestead south of town.

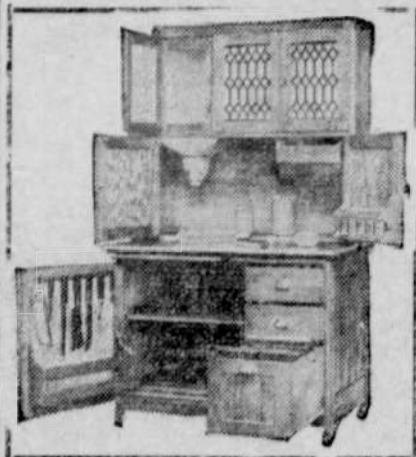
Messrs. S. F. Goss and C. T. Bennett were transacting business in Hood River between trains, yesterday afternoon.
