Tomatoes Blight

If some one could manufacture an efficient remedy for the counteracting of tomato blight he would probably have a small fortune at his command.

The tomato crop of the Hood River valley is practically out of commission this season and this is also true of many other sections.

Allie Henderson, the premier tomato grower of White Salmon and Bingen, was in the city Saturday and stated that practically his entire crop was injured by blight this year.

Mr. Henderson has nearly 50,000 plants set out this year and he figures that if he secures 10 per cent of a crop he will be doing as well as the outlook indicates.

It will be remembered that a man came to Mosier from White Salmon this past Spring and sold several thousand tomato plants which he said were "blight-proof."

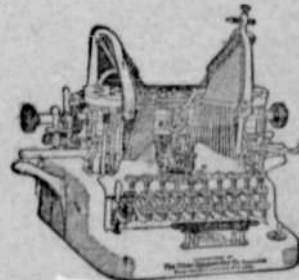
