FRUIT QUARANTINE MEASURE IS PASSED

The Simmons fruit quarantine bill, of great value to every fruitgrower and horticulturist on the Pacific Coast, passed the House Saturday.

The bill primarily was drawn to protect fruitgrowers against the Mediterranean fly and the Malolos Orange worm, the latter coming across the Mexican border and having created havoc in Southern California.

The bill appropriates \$25,000 for the first year and becomes effective October 1. After the first year the agricultural appropriation bill will carry an annual appropriation to enforce the quarantine.

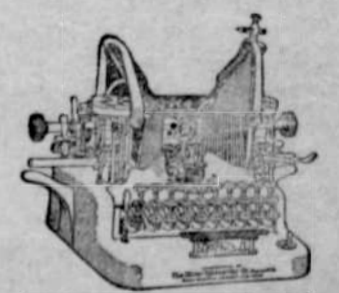
