PARAGRAPHS FROM IMMANUEL CHORCH

In his sermon last Sunday on "Getting ready to vote," speaking on the general relation of the church to society as a whole, Mr. Hargreaves said in part;

If the world is to be saved thru the centralizing of thought on the individual, a method largely in vogue at present, the process will be hopelessly long.

Sins are social as well as personal. Some of our most abominable conditions will be radically changed as social conditions change.
