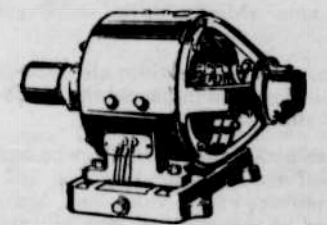

REGISTER

It will be well for the voter to remember that the registration books close on Oct. 5 next. If you did not register before the primary election, but "swore in" your vote on the day of election, you must register before Oct. 5 just the same, or repeat the form of "swearing in," which will cost you 25 cents, money down and no grumbling. If you don't like the idea, attend to business and register before Oct. 5. If you don't think enough of your American heritage to register at the proper time, you will be required to pay for the privilege of voting and the trouble to the election board of swearing in your vote on election day.
