Resume of World's Important Events Told in Brief.

Troops continue to move towards the Mexican border. Wilson will call an extra session of congress for April 1. The rule of military despotism seems to grow in favor in Mexico. Both houses of the South Dakota legislature adopted a resolution denouncing the killing of Madero and Suarez. Mexicans executed by shooting, one at a time, 95 Madero soldiers who revolted when they heard of the death of the ex-president. The Cornucopia Mining company, of Eastern Oregon, mails its gold bullion by insured parcels post to its head offices in Walla Walla. Mrs. Pankhurst, British suffragette leader, has been arrested for complicity in the recent bomb explosion which wrecked the house of Lord Churchill. The widow of Captain Scott, of Antarctic fame, has received from the British government the same title that she would have received had her husband returned alive, and will henceforth be known as Lady Scott. Kansas adopted a resolution declaring it "looked with horror upon the murder of President Madero and his vice president," and demanding that steps be taken by the United States to protect the lives of American citizens in Mexico. News of the execution of Francisco Madero caused such a sensation at Wichita Falls, Texas, that a petition is in circulation asking that the United States government request all Americans to leave Mexico and to take steps to punish those responsible for Madero's death. Arrangements are being made between the American and Russian governments to establish wireless stations across Bering sea and Siberia, which will complete the wireless circuit of the earth. A new waterfall 500 feet in height has been discovered on the Middle Fork of the Feather river, in an almost inaccessible canyon in the Sierra mountains of California. It is said to rival Bridal Veil falls of the Yosemite. Produce dealers of Portland, convicted of violating the Sherman anti-trust law, paid fines aggregating \$8,450, but will still be allowed to continue their association along certain lines. Immunity from prosecution for labor unions and farmers' organizations was included in the sundry civil appropriation bill in congress. Prominent Jews of the Pacific Coast are planning to take care of all their race who migrate to the Coast after the opening of the Panama canal. Los Angeles had a total rainfall of 5.2 inches in one night, and the entire city was flooded. Streetcars were stopped and boats and canoes were used in the streets. A destitute couple in Portland offered to give away their baby so that it might have a comfortable home, and nearly 200 applications were made for the child. A committee of ministers of St. Joseph, Mo., will attend a coming prayer night in that city, to obtain evidence and information to lay before the grand jury.

CHIEF IN PUNGENT COOKING

Humble Onion, One of the Mainstays of the Kitchen, Should Be More Widely Used.

Kitchen Lilies—No fancy nickname this, for the onion belongs to the lily tribe. It is an "allium" of which we eat the bulb. The eschalot, the leek, chives, garlic and romanesco—another variety of garlic, though much milder—are all of the same family. All are bulbs, all contain a volatile essential oil which is most valuable. They restore and heal the sick—who has not seen for grandmothers' onion soup for colds—who has not fled from grandmother's onion compress for coughs—their keep disease away (as disinfectants) they give beauty to the complexion! Onions are one of the finest nerve tonics known, and onions we must have in cookery—more especially in vegetable cookery. They should be considered the wit that enlivens the whole.

Here is a hint for those who would have a dish of boiled onions—some of the essential oil which causes them to occasionally indigest is removed by boiling them in two waters. Also, after skinning an onion—under water to keep from crying over it—cut out carefully all the base. Another hint—before frying or boiling onions for a dish parboil them to remove an excess of pungency. We all know that blonde onions are more delicate than the brunette varieties and that young onions or small ones are to be preferred to those of portly dimensions.

Growing Rhubarb in Winter.

It is not a difficult matter to force rhubarb during the winter and if properly done, people living near a good big market can make fine profit in this work. Rhubarb should be removed from the open garden with as much dirt clinging to the roots as possible. They should then be placed in two or three inches of soil and the spaces between the roots filled up with soil, well sprinkled and left to mature in comparative darkness. A kerosene lamp set on the floor in the cellar will supply all the heat necessary.
