Though no official announcement has yet been received, it is learned that the County Court, at its last session, has set apart the 30th day of June as the day on which the citizens of Mosier are to decide by ballot whether or not they shall incorporate.

It is, therefore, the duty of every progressive citizen to take an active interest in the coming election and vote for incorporation.

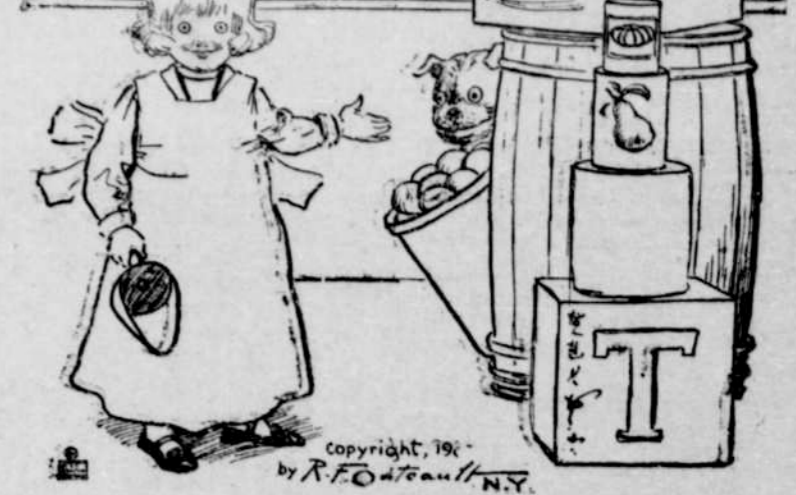
