HOW WILL YOU VOTE?

As stated last week, the county court has set June 30th as the date on which the citizens will vote on the question of incorporating the town, and the county clerk has caused the necessary election notices to be posted in conspicuous places about town. The following election board has been appointed by the court: Judges, Ames Root, H. G. Kibbee, Clerks, L. Lamb, S. F. Goss, W. A. Husbands. The polling place is the building just north of the Mosier Book Store, at one time occupied by D. D. Hall. The hours of voting are from 8 A. M. to 7 P. M.

As has been said before, this is a question which vitally concerns every resident within the proposed corporate limits, and every voter should consider the proposition carefully before deciding how he will vote. There seem to be some erroneous impressions current concerning the matter of taxes, the city officials, etc., which might be righted if all the people interested would get together some evening this coming week and talk these things over. We make this suggestion as the means to a better understanding of the question at issue.

SPELLING-BEE ENTERTAINS

This part of the evening's entertainment suggested the idea of giving a musical program, and this idea will probably be carried out in the near future.

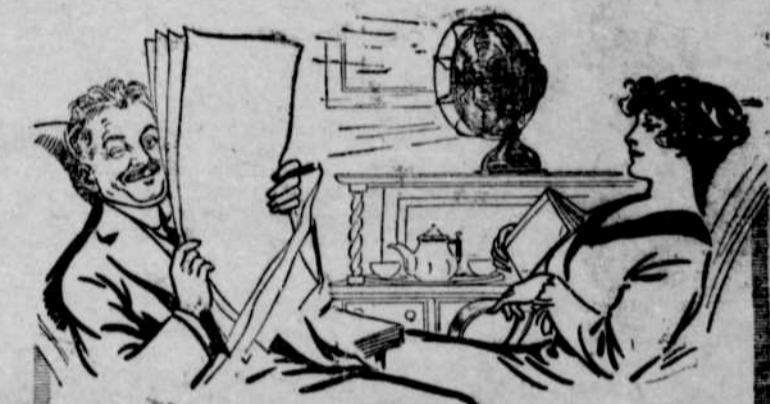
