### THE JOKER

Next Monday the people of Mosier are to decide whether or not they will incorporate the town, having as the corporate limits the boundaries described in the petition as published some time ago.

The citizens of Mosier are divided on the question of incorporation, some for one reason, some for another. Some think that the boundary lines were not laid out to the best advantage and that more territory should have been included; others fear that the cost of maintaining a city government will be prohibitive on account of increased taxation, etc., while others, principally the women voters, are afraid that, if the town is incorporated, there will be one or more saloons started here at once. The ladies say that certain individuals have told them that this would be the case. This "joker" has been slipped into the deck by these parties, who are evidently afraid of the women's vote, to scare them against voting for incorporation. But they didn't explain to the ladies that as this is a dry precinct, it would be necessary to vote at a general election on the "wet or dry" proposition, before they could have a saloon in Mosier, and that a petition, even if signed by a majority of the citizens, would not secure a saloon. So, ladies and gentlemen, do not be afraid to vote for incorporation on that score. The joker doesn't draw anything. Mosier doesn't need a saloon and doesn't want one. If the majority of the citizens don't want a saloon, there is no chance of getting one, if majority rules. That's all there is to that "joker." Don't be bluffed out.

As to the fear that it would be

too expensive maintaining a city government, the answer is that the expense would be no greater than a wise corps of city officials choose to make it, and it is up to the citizens to choose their officers. There is very little danger of the town, if incorporated, being burdened with obligations it couldn't meet, for it can be bonded only for a certain per cent of its assessed valuation.

Regarding the objection raised that the corporate boundaries

were not laid out to the satisfaction of many of the citizens, that cannot be remedied now, and the question will be voted on as it stands. Should we fail to carry the election this time, we will try again, and keep on trying until we succeed, for the majority of the citizens realize that incorporation spells Progress and Prosperity. It now resolves itself into a matter of agreement on boundary lines.

Anyhow, get out and vote. Have the courage of your convictions.

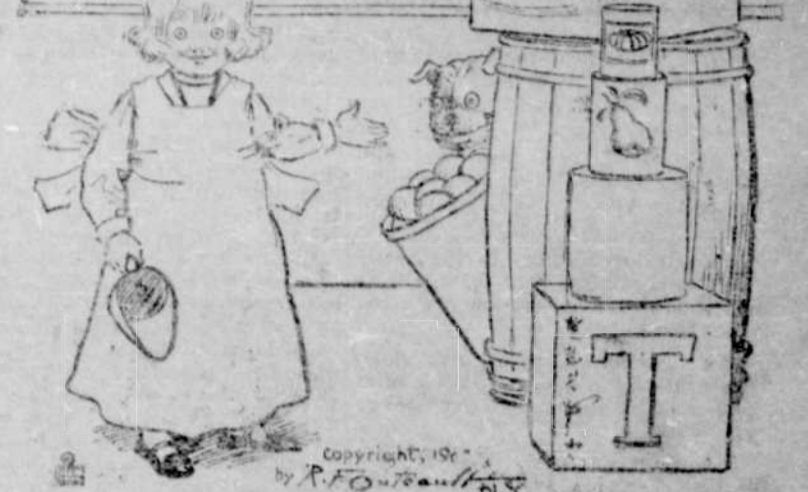
