It was his opinion that the expense of patting in permanent fishways would be almost prohibitive, and he suggested stocking the upper creek each Horse year with trout fry, and straightening the channel of the creek below the bridge to the river. At present the mouth of creek points up the river, due to the circuitous course of the creek and the constant changing of the channel by the high water and drifting sands. Owing to this peculiar condition, very few large fish find their way into the creek, which deprives fishers of much sport that is enjoyed in almost all the other tributaries of the Columbia.
