APPLE HOUSES

As the area of apple orchards in the Mosier District has increased from year to year, the demand for storage room has of course increased in proportion. A comparatively short time ago there were but one or two storage houses here, and the fruit growers of the district made a community convenience of them, thus holding their crops at home until they could be marketed.

One of latest to be built is that recently finished by Ed. L. Howe, at his Lebowa Fruit Farm. This is a combination packing and storage house, and is, without a doubt, the most complete, convenient and up-to-date private building of this kind that ingenuity could conceive or money buy.

paper, the cartons, etc. The only thing the storage plant does not possess is a refrigerator; but this necessity is obviated by the ingenious construction of the building and the scientific system of ventilation.

The building stands on a side hill and roads have been graded around it so that wagons can be loaded, by means of trucks, on a level with either floor. On the inside is a "lift" for the raising and lowering of boxes from floor to floor. The plan of the entire building is so well arranged in relation to space, convenience in handling fruit, etc., that the work is reduced to a science in simplicity.
