## -0.0.0 BUENA VISTA FARM

From a tract of heavily wooded timber to a well improved farm in about a year's time, is the record made by E. B. Vensel, manager of the "Buena Vista "Orchards," about six miles southeast of town. This tract, conacres, was obginally known as the Brooks timber claim. Mr. W. W. Vensel, a Pittsburg, Pa., -capitalist, purchased the tract about two years ago from Wm. Neilson, who had previously acquired this and the Sundborg land, adjoining.

About a year ago Mr. Vensel put a large force of men on his land to clearing and in this brief time all the land has been cleared and thirty acres set to commercial trees.
