## JIM KELLY'S HAT IN THE RING

Ex-Mayor of The Dalles Agrees to Make Race for Legislature.

J. L. ## LOUIS WARD BURIED HERE

Former Newspaper man Passes Away in Spokane—Had Lived Here.

Louis E. Ward, son of Mrs. Rebecca Ward of Portland, and nephew of Mrs. Marietta Harlan, of Mosier, died at Spokane on Thursday, March 19, at the hospital in that city. Death was caused by a tumorous growth on the intestines. He was taken suddenly ill on the Monday before and an operation was performed on Tuesday, from which he failed to recover.

Deceased was born 33 years ago at Alma, Nebraska. For the past seven years he had lived in Oregon. In 1907 he went with his wife, to Ione and purchased the Ione Proclaimer. They later sold out and went to Echo and started the Echo Echoes. In 1911 Mr. Ward went to Duluth, Minn., where he was president of the Duluth and Superior Collection Agency, for a year, when he moved back to Oregon, locating in Portland. He was a member of the International Lathers' Union, having learned the trade years ago. About a month ago he went to Spokane to work on the Davenport hotel, in course of construction, leaving his family in Portland.

Deceased was held in high esteem by his fellow workmen and a host of friends and acquaintances. On Saturday of last week, all the members of all the unions working on the Davenport hotel, took up a collection and tendered the proceeds to the widow.

Mr. Ward spent a month in Mosier last winter, where he was night watchman at the steam shovel at the rock crusher, and was on several occasions a valuable assistant in the Bulletin office.

The remains were brought to Mosier for burial last Friday, Rev. W. A. Stark of Hood River conducting the services at the home of Mrs. Harlan. A number of beautiful floral pieces were sent from Portland by friends of the family.

Mrs. L. E. Ward, with her little daughter, accompanied her husband's remains from Spokane and was met here by Mr. Ward's mother, Mrs. Rebecca Ward, Mr. and Mrs. E. E. Ward and daughter Miss Alta, of Portland. The body was interred in the Odd Fellows Cemetery.
