ANNOUNCEMENT.

In compliance with the several petitions presented to me, I hereby announce my candidacy for Joint Representative of the 29th District of Wasco and Hood River counties, subject to the will of the Republican voters at the regular primaries, May 15th 1914.

The following is my platform, not merely for election but for enactment, if in my power to do so.

I favor the amendment of our tax laws, whereby no penalty will be added to the latter half of taxes until they become due, and further, I am opposed to any rebate for advanced taxes.

I favor a system of road laws that will permit the taxpayers to select the roads upon which their money is to be expended, and for permanent improvement, and I favor compelling the work to be done in such manner and under such authority that will eliminate the waste that has prevailed heretofore in road construction in this state.

I favor the enactment of a public utility law giving the people the power to organize into districts and install any public utility when they so desire. Some of our counties, especially Hood River, are now demanding such a law.

I favor a law giving the citizens of any county, complete control over the salaries of their county officials.

I favor a law giving the governor the power to veto any portion of any proposed law, especially those carrying with them any appropriations.

While I believe it is right for representatives to assist each other in earnest work for the passage of each other's just and honorable bills, yet I am unalterably opposed to the wholesale swapping of legislation whether there is merit in the measure or not, and I will pledge, if elected, not to support any measure I consider morally or technically wrong.

I believe it is unjust to ask the counties along the Columbia river east of Multnomah, to build the Columbia River Road. When this expensive road is built connecting Eastern and Western Oregon, I believe it should be done at the expense of the state. It would have been just as reasonable to ask Oregon to have built the \$10,000,000 locks at Celilo Falls as to ask our district to build its portion of this road.

I favor the curtailment in our state expenses, and especially the abolishment of useless and expensive commissions. If our state management was conducted on business principles many thousands of dollars could be saved.

I believe in fewer and more essential laws and am opposed to further complicated and needless ones.

If any new elective offices are to be created by our legislature and said offices are to be first filled by appointment, I shall not vote for such a bill, if said appointments are to be extended beyond the next general election as was done at our last legislature relative to our county attorneys.

I believe the sovereignty of the people should always be recognized and any "jokers" contained in any proposed legislation destroying the same, shall have my strongest opposition.

I was one of the first committee of three to start agitation for our Initiative and Referendum laws in Oregon. For eleven years we battled against its opponents before it was declared a constitutional law. After ten years of its enforcement in this state, I am more convinced of its benefits to society than ever, and I shall be ready at all times to defend it.

I favor our legislature sending a strong memorial to our National Congress demanding absolutely free tolls through the Panama canal for all American vessels which are not controlled by the railroads of this country.

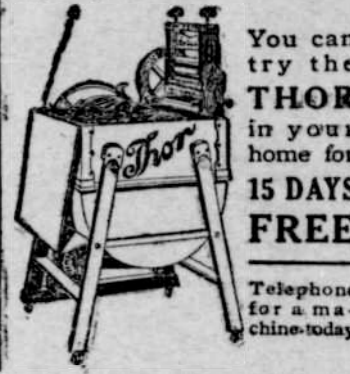
