FOR COLUMBIA RIVER HIGHWAY

Messrs. A. W. Mohr, county surveyor, and J. A. Elliott, Columbia River Highway engineer, under Major Bowlby, were in town last week making a preliminary survey for the highway between Mosier and the top of Seven Mile hill. Mr. Mohr stated that by running up Dry creek and coming out on the old Hardwick place, a five per cent grade could be obtained. This week they will run out preliminary lines from the top of the hill in to The Dalles, and it is estimated that as good a grade can be secured on the east of the mountains.

There seems to be a difference of opinion regarding the route the highway should take between Mosier and The Dalles. Some think that advantage should be taken of the road already partly built and called the river road. This road is open as far as Mayerdale, on the Mosier end, and is practically built from The Dalles west to the head of Hog canyon, leaving not over two miles of road to be opened up. The road up Rowena Hill is too heavy a grade for practical purposes, and it is declared that a grade not greater than seven per cent can be had. But complaint is made that there are nothing but "sand dunes" on this route. As a matter of fact, the road does not follow the river at all until Rowena is reached, going east, and then not close enough to be seriously affected by sand.

On the other hand, some claim that by the time tourists have reached Mosier they have seen enough of the river scenery and would prefer to get birdseye views of the surrounding country, as seen from the hills which would be crossed on the other route. There is no doubt that some of the finest scenery on the entire route is to be seen from the bluff overlooking the Columbia River at Ortely; scenery worth going miles out of the way to view. From a scenic standpoint, the saving of a little time and labor would appeal to some. But the main thing is to get busy and do something that will assure us the Columbia River Highway.

Substitute for Butter.

Dr. J. H. Kellogg of Battle Creek, Michigan, it is reported, has perfected a new vegetable butter. This is made entirely out of vegetable fats, and while it looks like butter and tastes like butter, it is much more easily handled by the human system than butter itself. The new product has a flavor similar to that of good dairy butter, and those who have sampled it testify that it is delicious. Some of this has already been served in a Battle Creek sanitarium dining room.

The new product, it is said, contains no stearin or animal fat. Another feature is that it is cheaper and if placed upon the market might help to solve the high cost of living, for it could be sold as low as oleomargarine, and contains no so-called harmful ingredients. The process of manufacture is as yet in its infancy, but it is thought that if the product is found to be as good as it is believed to be, it will be put on the market.

One of the sanitarium dietitians states that eventually the new butter will be used extensively for cooking purposes, and it will take the place of lard. It can be used wherever butter can be used in cooking. If the above is the case does not sound fishy, it sounds like the ring of oleo.—Butter, Cheese and Egg Journal.

He served three years as constable of that city and was for three years chief of police. He is at present in the grocery business.

Ed Kurtz, likewise a democratic candidate for sheriff, will be in town this week. Mr. Kurtz is a well known business man of the Dalles and has been identified with the politics of the county for a number of years, being considered a wheel horse of the democratic party.

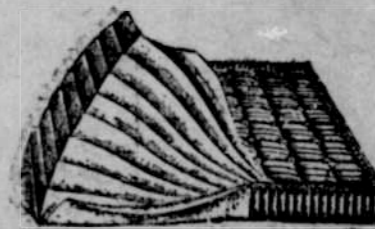
