**PURE FOOD MAN HERE**

**GIVES MOSIER GOOD BILL OF HEALTH**

W. W. Duncan, deputy State Dairy and Food Commissioner, is making a tour of inspection of all the cities and towns in the state where foodstuff is manufactured and sold, also inspecting all eating houses, markets, bakeries, city dairies and slaughter-houses. He was in Mosier on Tuesday of this week and spoke very highly of Mosier's sanitary condition so far as related to his line of work and considering that this was first time Mosier had been inspected. It was reported about town Tuesday morning that a certain brand of a table article was sure to be condemned and some of those who dealt in or used that article "got under cover" with it; but their scare was unnecessary, as one party who carried the same goods called the commissioner's particular attention to it on his shelves and it was pronounced all right.

Speaking of Mosier's condition, Mr. Duncan said: "We find that the scores for this town will average well with any of the other small towns. The grocery stores were cleaner and the goods found to be in good condition."
