Day to be Set Apart for Work Columbia Highway, State and County Roads

It is said that 2000 business men of Portland will leave that city on the morning of the 25th, armed with picks and shovels, for Bridal Veil, where they will put in the day working on the Columbia River highway. While it will be considered a "lark" by all of them, and perhaps little real hard work will be performed by many who are accustomed to wielding nothing heavier than a pen, it shows the right spirit in the Portlanders and their interest in the building of this great highway, which will mean so much to Oregon when finished.

Not having this highway to work on as yet, the citizens of Mosier and Wasco county in general should still observe the day by turning out in force and working the roads in their immediate vicinity. A good idea plan would be for the citizens of the town to clean up the streets, remove the humps and fill up the hollows and improve things generally. There is plenty of it to be done. REDUCTION IN TAXES IS PROMISE OF JOHNS

REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR SAYS HE WOULD CUT EXPENSES OF STATE GOVERNMENT

ABOLISH USELESS BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS IS SLOGAN OF EX-MAYOR OF BAKER

Portland, Or., April 14.—Reduce taxes, abolish all useless commissions and boards and cut expenses of state government. This is the slogan of Charles A. Johns, Portland attorney, ex-mayor of Baker, who is making a clean-cut race for Republican nomination for Governor. The platform of Mr. Johns is free from claptrap. It is straight from the shoulder, with a promise to reduce expenses. "If you like the things for which I stand," concludes the platform, "vote for me. If the platform does not appeal to you, vote for someone else, because my declaration of principles means what it says."

Mr. Johns believes the taxpayers of Oregon are awake to the fact that taxes of this state have made an alarming increase out of all ratio to the gain in population. "We cannot expect to attract capital and settlers to Oregon," he says, "unless we offer them more attractive inducements than our neighbors. Taxes are the first statistics to which the prospector or farmer looks before placing money or making a home in a new country. Oregon taxes are too high.
