CANDIDATES' ROUND-UP

COUNTY CANDIDATES WILL MEET HERE TOMORROW

Tomorrow afternoon, at Chown's Hall, a majority of the county primary candidates will be an exhibition to the voters of Mosier District and it behooves the citizens to be on hand to "size up" the bunch. Many of the candidates have been in Mosier at one time or another during the primary campaign, but there are many of the voters who have not seen them, and all they know about them is what they have heard or read. The average voter likes to think he can size up a man for himself better than some one else can do it for him, and he generally wants to see the man he would support at the polls.

It has not been definitely learned yet if there will be any gubernatorial candidates present, but it is hoped that there will be at least one—Judge Bennet, of The Dalles. The time at the meeting will be occupied with talks from the candidates for representative, and opportunity will also be given all the other county candidates to "get their oar in."

It made a little mistake, for it is not the idea of the voters to cut up and roast any of the candidates at this meeting—that will probably be done next Friday, at the polls. But, lest they make a mistake in the cutting and roasting then, it were wise for them to turn out to-morrow in order to determine, if possible, who not to roast at the primary.

So it is hoped and expected that all the voters of the district will take a half day off to-morrow to get acquainted with the candidates for nomination.
