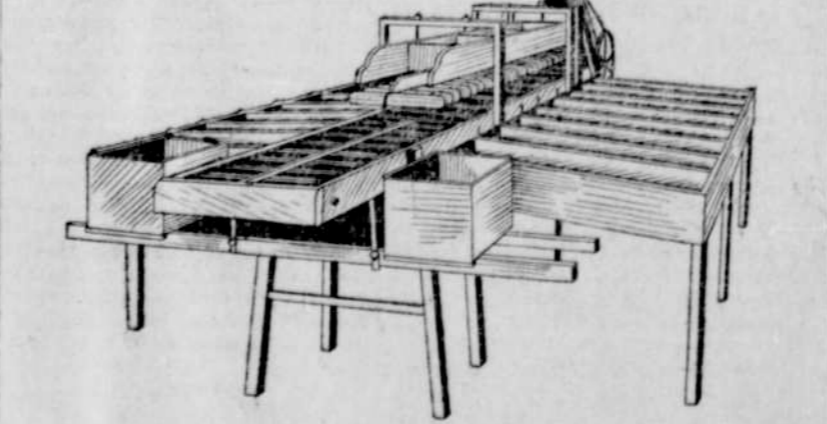
THE OREGON BOX

They will be beneficial not alone to Pacific Coast fruit raisers, but to the growers of apples all over the United States.
