WAR WILL AFFECT APPLE MARKET

According to J. H. Steinhardt, of the firm of Steinhardt & Kelly, of New York, who are perhaps the largest handlers of Northwest fruit, the apple market will be crippled by the war. Mr. Steinhardt is quoted as saying:

"The war has put a stop for the present to speculation in apples and indications are there will be little outright buying. Five hundred boxes of pears and 1008 boxes of apples were shipped to Europe last week as compared with 30 carloads of fruit (15,000 boxes) during the corresponding week last year. I have just had 20 carloads of Winter pears cancelled by my European buyers. This shows why speculators are not buying. England will take practically no apples. Even if the war is of short duration, all the money will be needed to buy necessities. Germany, our largest customer, is not to be considered. Heretofore Germany has sold Northwestern apples to Southwestern and Russia Europe. The most hopeful sign in the pear situation is that speculators are buying the New York Bartlett's at two cents a pound for canning. This leaves the fancy market to the Oregon, California and Colorado pears. The turning of nearly 4,000,000 boxes of Canadian apples on to the markets of this country is one serious feature of the war."

MARK A 'MAYER ENTERTAINS TODAY

Mayerdale, the palatial country home of Mark A. Mayer, will be the scene today of an informal luncheon tendered by Mr. Mayer to the members of the county court, several other county officials, S. Benson, father of the Columbia River Highway, Major Bowby, of the Highway Commission, both of Portland, and a number of local citizens. The occasion is in the nature of a celebration of the completion of the road which the county, in conjunction with Mr. Mayer and other citizens, has been building from Mayerdale west to Mosier, and to give his guests an opportunity to examine the finished road, which is like a boulevard, and to learn the method of construction.

THE DALLES HAS BIG FIRE

Fire, supposedly of incendiary origin, destroyed three business blocks in The Dalles last Saturday night. The fire was the worst and most costly that the city has experienced in years. There were three distinct fires, all some distance apart, but all were started within a short space of time of each other. The first fire broke out in some Indian huts west of town, attracting a crowd; the next fire was in the old Baldwin opera house, west of the Umatilla Hotel, and the last and serious blaze was started in the old cannery, back of the post office. The cannery was destroyed, as was also the brick block in which the post office and Brill's store were located, owned by the Odd Fellows. Louis Comini lost his marble works plant and residence, with no insurance. The Great Northern Furniture Store was burned and other buildings on both sides of Second Street were more or less damaged. The total loss is estimated at over \$110,000. Misses Alefora and Leodica Haack, who have been packing prunes and visiting friends for several weeks, returned to their home in Portland on Tuesday.

FREAK PEACH TREE

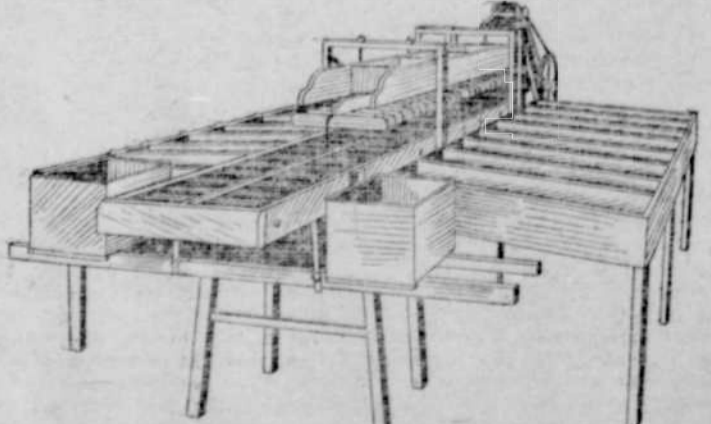
