MARK A. MAYER ENTERTAINS ROAD BUILDERS

An event of unusual importance was celebrated last Friday afternoon when Mark A. Mayer, that prince of good fellows, entertained a number of good roads builders and boosters from Portland, The Dalles and Mosier, the occasion being the completion of the road between Mayerdale and Mosier. It was Mr. Mayer's idea to have his guests examine the road and to get an expression of their opinion as to the character and stability of the work. It was evident that those present, particularly the members of the county court and Messrs. Benson and Bowlby, of Portland, were greatly pleased with the work, as the road is a perfect boulevard for a distance of a mile and a half. Major Bowlby, than whom there is no better authority on road building, stated that the road was the best in the country with the exception of Sam Hill's road at Maryhill, which cost more, mile for mile.

Mr. S. Benson, the father of the Columbia River Highway, hoped to see the day in the not distant future, when the public would travel on just such a road from Portland to Pendleton.

The county officials were highly gratified with the work and Mr. Mayer was complimented on the manner in which it was done.

After the guests had inspected the perfectly kept grounds, the numerous buildings which form a little city in itself, and the poultry yards, of which Mr. Mayer is justly proud, he escorted them into the spacious dining hall and seated them at two elegantly appointed banquet tables beautifully decorated with smilax and vari-colored roses. The "band out" consisted of about ten or more courses, served a la Dalmone, of everything good to eat and drink—it was noticed that there were glasses of water on the tables, and there was plenty of it left.

During the banquet, which occupied three hours, and over which Judd Fish presided as toastmaster, speeches were made by nearly all present and they abounded in praise of the work

which had been so well begun. The speakers dwelt on the importance of the completion of the Columbia River Highway, of which the Mayerdale road will ultimately form a link, of the beautiful scenery along the route, grander than anything of which Europe can boast, and of the inestimable value it would be to the whole state in opening up an east to west main artery of travel, over which many thousands of automobilizing tourists will pass every year. Many of them, impressed by the scenery and the unlimited opportunities for profitable investment, will locate among us, increasing our population and wealth. This is what the completion of the Columbia Highway means to Wasco, Hood River, Multnomah and all the counties thru which it will pass. This is what Mr. Benson has foreseen and has given of his time and money to help accomplish, and this is what Mark A. Mayer is helping to accomplish by putting his money into the stretch of elegant paved road leading east to Mayerdale.

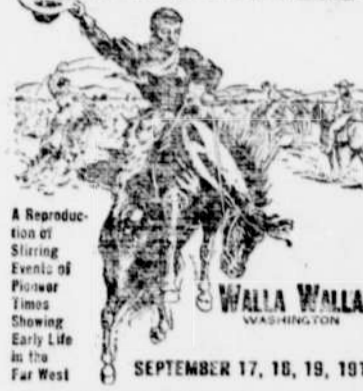
Space forbids even a resume of the many good speeches made, but they were all enthusiastic and full of bright pictures of the future.

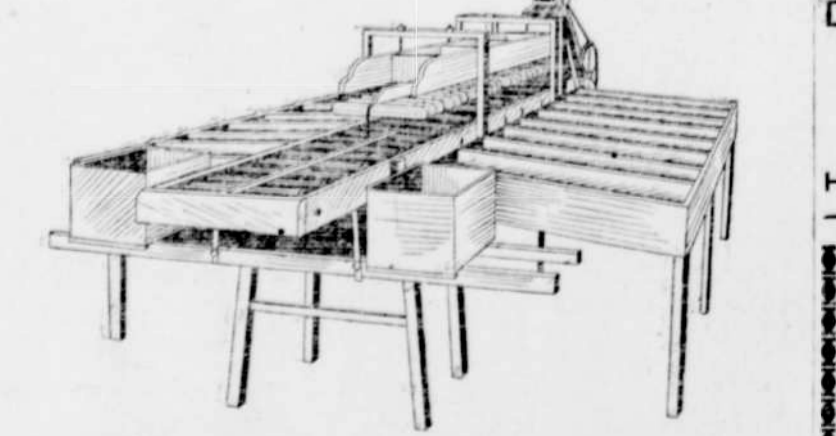
