ED L. HOWE PASSES
Edgar L. Howe, for years a prominent fruit raiser of Mosier, died last Thursday evening at his home, "Lehove," of cirrhosis of the liver, from which he had suffered for years.
Mr. Howe was born in Council Bluffs, Iowa, May 29, 1864. For some years he was the traveling representative of Burley & Co., of Chicago. In 1895 he came to Portland and was married in that year to Miss Leila Eliot Biles. In 1906 Mr. Howe came to Mosier and purchased a tract of land from Wm. Evans. This land he improved until today it is one of the finest fruit farms in Oregon.
The funeral was held from Immanuel Church Saturday forenoon last, the services being conducted by Rev. McNamara, of the Episcopal Church of Hood River. The church was filled with friends and neighbors and the floral offerings were profuse and most beautiful.
The body was laid to rest in Odd Fellows cemetery.
Mr. Howe is survived by his wife, mother and a sister, who have the sympathy of a host of friends and acquaintances.
