PAINLESS PARKER PERSECUTED
The efforts of the dental trust of Oregon to run "Painless Parker" out of the state would be amusing if they were not so manifestly unjust. Why should Dr. Parker be boycotted simply because his methods of conducting his business are different from the trust? Why should he not advertise his style of work or his harmless anesthetic, the same as any other up-to-date business man advertises his stock in trade, whatever it may be? Because it is "unethical." Why the dental trust should consider it so we are not prepared to say, but it appears that they do. The average dentist will blow in as much as 50c a month for a professional card, and of course the printer is thankful for small favors. But would not the aforesaid a.d. get more business if he did more advertising? Dr. Parker is evidently obnoxious to the "orthodox" dentists because he makes a generous and judicious use of printers' ink. He believes in educating the public in the care and preservation of the teeth, thus saving unnecessary dentist bills and much pain, especially for the children. He knows there will always be plenty of work to do for the hundreds of thousands of people who have neglected their teeth. Dr. Parker may be considered a public benefactor in making demonstrations on the streets of Portland. The dental trust has made strenuous efforts to have the city council of Portland refuse Dr. Parker the privilege of making these public demonstrations, and it is greatly to Mayor Albee's credit that he refused to sign the order restraining him, on the ground that it was discriminating against an individual. So strong has been the opposition of the dental trust that Dr. Parker has succeeded in having placed on the ballot at the November election an initiative measure which will allow all persons who have graduated from any reputable dental college and

persons who have been licensed to practice dentistry under the laws of any other state, to practice dentistry in the state of Oregon. This measure is numbered 340 on the ballot, and if the voters of Mosier and of every other precinct in Oregon believe in fair play, they will certainly vote for the passage of this measure.
