### Free Moose Vocational School and Sanitarium

The Supreme Lodge on Jan. 1st 1913, purchased 1000 acres of land on the Fox River near Aurora, Ill. On this site they are erecting a large Industrial School at a cost of five million dollars. Orphans and children whose parents are unable to educate them will be given a vocational training will fit them for life. A large Moose Sanitarium and home for aged and infirm members will also be erected here. The location is within an hour's ride from the heart of Chicago. The Postoffice and name of the railway station is Mooseheart.

Vice-President Thos. R. Marshall, together with other prominent characters, laid the corner stone of this institution with impressive ceremonies on July 27th, 1913. Fifty thousand people witnessed the dedication. A number of children have already been admitted and more will be added from time to time.

### Origin of the Order

The Loyal Order of Moose was organized April 12, 1888. It is not a class organization, but it is open to all good white male citizens, Professional, Business and Working Men, of sound mind and body, of good standing in the community and engaged in lawful occupation, between the ages of 21 and 50 years. Applicants who are above the age limit or who cannot pass the medical examination may be admitted as social members. The dues for social members are seven dollars per year. All applicants are investigated by a committee and voted on by the lodge.

### Characteristics

Among the chief characteristics of the Loyal Order of Moose is its Originality and Progressiveness. The Moose does not pattern after other fraternities, but launches out into new fields--Clubs, Colleges, Athletic Unions and homes for widows and orphans.

The Loyal Order of Moose does not tolerate interference with one's religious or political views. Political or sectarian discussions are not countenanced in the lodge rooms, but Patriotism, Obedience to Law, Equal Rights, and Respect for Opinions of Others insisted upon. As one enters the lodge, so he departs--a free man.
