# MEXICANS BATTLE

Border Raiders Massed Along Rio Grande River.

#### TEN POACHERS SLAIN IN DAY'S FIGHT

One U. S. Trooper Wounded-Grave Possibilities Thought Imminent From Mexican Invasions.

Brownsville, Tex .- With hordes of Mexicans reported massed along the river where a sharp battle between American cavalry and Mexicans took place, 65 miles west of here, with communication between here and San Benito in the raided district all but broken by wire cutters and a sudden calling to quarters of all troops stationed at Fort Brown, the situation growing out of Sunday's hostilities developed swifty to one of grave possi-

At Cavazos Crossing, near Old Hi-dalgo, Tex., where United States cavalrymen and Mexicans across the river Dalles-Columbia Line engaged in an all-day battle, ending late in the afternoon, the south bank of the Rio Grande was reported literally lined with Mexicans, well armed, but it could not be ascertained whether

they included any Carranza soldiers. In the day's battle, Captain Frank R. McCoy, commanding the United States cavalry engaged, reported that at least 10 Mexicans were killed, their bodies lying exposed on the plain south of the international boundary. He believed that as many more were killed in their ambush in the brush.
