## CALIFORNIA CROPS **NEARLY ALL SHIPPED**

Grapes Are Only Thing Left of Deciduous Fruit and Weather Is Spoiling Those.

The California Fruit Distributors have issued the following weekly letter to the trade:

The following gives the number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped to all points by all members of this company for the week (seven days) ending Monday night, November 1,

Grapes, 450 cars-By comparing this week's output of grapes with that of one week ago it will be seen that the number of cars moving has been practically the same. From this time on it is expected that shipments will materially decrease.

Cornichons and Emperors are moving out quite freely and the latter particularly are experiencing a very satisfactory f. o. b. demand. These grapes are in good condition, and should be very profitable for storage purposes.

Weather-A small shower Thursday morning is the only unfavorable development of the weather since our last report. The rainfall was very trifling, however, and will probably have no particular effect on fruit.

We strongly advise all customers to place their orders for grapes at once, as we have now arrived at that time in the year when future shipments are very uncertain, depending as they do entirely upon weather conditions. Put in your orders now while you are sure of getting your supplies.
