The Anderson mining ditch was located in 1861. Of recent years it has been little used for mining purposes, but covering as it does quite an acreage of good fruit land, it has brought good returns from the sale of water for irrigation purposes. it is thought that the city can find it profitable to repair it in places needed and continue the sale of water from it, thereby earning the interest cost on the investment.
