MANY EXHIBITS ENTERED IN SHOW

Oregon Growers Have Made 43 Entries in the National Apple Show, Soon to Open in Spokane.

(Mail Tribune Special Service.) SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 11.—Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and the province of British Columbia are so far represented by 45 growers in the contests on 10-box displays at the national apple show in Spokane, beginning on November 15. There are 10 competitions in this class, the chief prizes being a five-acre tract of orchard land in the Meadow Lake district, west of Spokane, valued at \$1250, and five acres of land with water rights in the Lakeview district, Oregon, valued at \$1000; also two premiums of \$150 each to first and \$50 to second and six of \$100 each to first and \$50 to second.

In addition to the foregoing the best ten boxes of any variety grown along the Northern Pacific Railway company's main line or branches will receive a solid silver loving cup, while the Better Fruit trophy cup will be awarded to the exhibitor of the best ten-box pack. Exhibitors of Rome Beauty apples are also eligible for the Williams' Twice Winner cup, held by George Farwell of Wenatchee.

The Meadow Lake prize is on Rome Beauty apples, the Lakeview premium being on Winter Bananas, while the Silver Grill purses, each of \$200, of which \$150 is to firsts, are on Winesap and Wagener. The others are on Spitzenberg, McIntosh Red, Arkansas Black, Yellow Newtown Pippin, Delicious and any other variety not named.

The management has also received 43 entries from growers in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, New York and the province of British Columbia in the five-box competitions. There are nine contests, with prizes of \$50 to firsts and \$15 to second, on Black Twig, Baldwin, Rhode Island Greening, Northern Spy, Stayman Winesap, Ben Davis, Grimes Golden, King of Tompkins County and any variety not named, and one competition on Jonathan apples, the winner receiving the Brother Jonathan trophy and \$25, also premiums in kind on three and a half, four, four and a half and five-tier fruit.

Growers in the four northwestern states and provinces have sent 58 entries in the single box competitions on these varieties: Yellow Bellflower, McIntosh Red, Winter Banana, Spitzenberg, Arkansas Black, Cox Orange Pippin, Sierra Beauty, Winesap, Delicious, Jonathan, Rome Beauty, Wagener, Golden Russet, Stayman Winesap, Grimes Golden, Black Twig, Northern Spy, Ben Davis and Baldwin. MAYOR TO FIGHT MONEY SHARKS

All Salary Loan Agencies in Spokane Will Be Prosecuted by Mayor Pratt if They Charge Over Twelve Per Cent.

(Mail Tribune Special Service.) SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 11.—Salary loan agencies, chattel mortgage houses and easy-payment concerns charging more than 12 per cent interest, the legal rate in Washington, will be prosecuted under the usury law by Mayor Nelson S. Pratt of Spokane, without the cost of a penny to the victims. He gave out this statement in announcing the foregoing.

"If every person in Spokane who is in the hands of salary loan sharks or the mortgage octopus will call at my office in the city hall I will afford them the relief granted by the supreme court of the state of Washington." This is believed to be the beginning of a state-wide fight on agencies, backed largely by eastern capital, which have been established in Spokane and other cities and towns throughout the state during the last few years. Many complaints have been made in Spokane that the interest charges are usurious, also that foreclosures have followed in numerous instances.

GIRL BURNS IN SPITE OF MOTHER'S DESPERATE FIGHT

(United Press Leased Wire.) WALLA WALLA, Wash., Nov. 11.—Lola Fox is today dying and her mother, Mrs. Mollie Fox, is severely burned as a result of the daughter's clothing catching on fire yesterday. While the mother was out milking, Lola sat in front of an open grate. It is believed that the warmth caused her to fall asleep. When her mother entered the room she found her daughter's clothing ablaze. She dashed the contents of a bucket of milk she was carrying over the child, but this failed to quench the flames. Finally she stripped the burning clothing from the child's body with her bare hands, but not until Lola was fatally burned.
