## UTAH COPPER IS MOST ACTIVE

Trading Borders on Sensational on New York Exchange—Announcements Active for a Saturday.

(United Press Leased Wire)

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—Utah Copper shares bordered on the sensational in stock market trading today. With total sales of all securities only 357,900 shares today there was an advance of 7 1/2 points and a net gain of 6 1/2 points in that security during the trading.

Announcements was active for a Saturday and held a closing gain of 23-8 points, while Amalgamated was 15-8 higher than yesterday. Smelter common fell the advance in the coppers and closed 11-8 points higher.

While the rest of the list was generally higher, changes as compared with yesterday were but a fraction or two.

## CHICAGO MARKET FOR FUTURES IS DEPRESSED

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 13.—Market for wheat futures was weak and depressed all day, closing being 7-8 to 1 cent below yesterday's final prices. The market started under very heavy selling pressure, which sent the December to \$1.06, or 3/4 cent under yesterday; May, \$1.04 1/4, compared with \$1.053-8 yesterday, and July, 97-3-8c, compared with 97 1/2c.

Outsiders gave the market all the support they could, but nothing availed the bull side during the trading.

Liverpool acted with bullish caution and closed 1-8 to 3/4 above yesterday.

"Gentlemen: Answering your inquiry as to whether any claims have been filed with the Southern Pacific Railroad company on any of the 57 cars pre-cooled by your company during the shipping season of 1909, I take pleasure in informing you that in no instance has a claim been filed with the railroad company, with the exception of a few minor losses and damage claims, due to breakage, etc., on any of these cars.

"I take the opportunity to add that of all my cars, amounting to 12 or more, shipped into the northwest territory were pre-cooled, with the exception of one not pre-cooled, and all were accepted without reclamation except the one not pre-cooled. I was obliged to allow a claim of \$218.76 for the poor arrival of the fruit. All deciduous shippers, outside of myself, have sustained heavy losses in shipping to the northwest the past season. I consider my success due entirely to the fact that all my fruit shipped into the northwest territory was pre-cooled, with the exception of the one car above mentioned.
