

4-STORY BRICK CENTRAL POINT

Several Important Real Estate Deals Take Place in That City— Big New Business Block.

(Mail Tribune Special Service.) CENTRAL POINT, Or., Nov. 13.—Several important real estate deals have been made during the past few days by the C. S. Sanderson Real Estate company. The most important of these is the sale of the property known as the Williams corner on Main street by E. L. Farrar and G. S. Mains to William Cowley of Concord, N. H., who proposes erecting a four-story office building 82x140 in size during the coming season. This structure will add materially to the business buildings of Central Point.

S. S. Aiken of Prospect purchased lots 5 and 6 of block 30 of the original townsite of Central Point, the consideration being \$225.

HOLDS RECORD LAND LOCATIONS

Jackson County Claims Man Who Holds Record for Locating Innumerable Land Claims in the West.

Jackson county claims as one of its citizens the man with the record for land locations in the west—that is, individual locations.

This party first located in North Dakota, just after the civil war, when Uncle Sam was anxious to give everyone a farm. The climate of Dakota becoming too warm to suit the old veteran, he sold his homestead to a tenderfoot and wended his way to Wyoming, where he repeated his Dakota performance. Congress having in the meantime passed one of those enabling acts which wipe away one's previous record in the land department and presents a second, or in this case a third farm to the man desirous of living on the frontier.

The Wyoming farm disposed of, our champion moved to Idaho and repeated the operation, an enabling act of the accommodating United States congress intervening, of course. Finally, like the western bound immigrants, his course was stopped by the Pacific ocean and the Big Butte country is the scene of his last effort to acquire that farm which Uncle Sam promised him over 40 years ago.

Here he has settled on unurveyed land, and has located claims for other members of his family. He has exhausted all of his own rights except that as pertains to an old soldier, and is basing his claim for a tract of valuable timber land of the upper Rogue river section on his record as a civil war veteran.

The only time in the course of his career when he did not dispose of his claim at a profit was when he located on land covered by one of the Oregon irrigation projects. This claim he relinquished to the government, and has regretted it ever since.

BIG BAG BOB-CATS NAILED BY LAD

Eleven-Year-Old Boy Brings in 11 Bobcat Scalps and Claims \$18 Reward From Clerk.

Frank Wooldridge of the Applegate section appeared before the county court Friday with the skins of 11 "bobcats" killed by himself in the vicinity of his home. Owing to failure to comply with the requirements of the law he was allowed the bounty of \$2 on but nine of them, but that helped some.

Young Wooldridge is only about 11 years of age and has captured the animals represented by the skins alone, his only help being his dog. About the proudest youngster that ever walked through the corridors of the courthouse was young Wooldridge, with that \$18 county warrant in his pocket.

Such a haul by a lad of his age indicates the increase in the number of predatory animals in southern Oregon and shows why deer and such like game are diminishing in numbers. Eleven "bobcats" or Canada lynx as they really are, will do away with many a head of game during a single season.

REFUSE ABSOLUTION TO USERS OF SCHOOL BOOKS

NANTES, France, Nov. 13.—In fulfillment of its warning sounded when the church has been placed upon certain school books which the clergy considered offensive to the Catholic church, the priests today are refusing absolution to the Catholic school children who are using the books interdicted by this church.

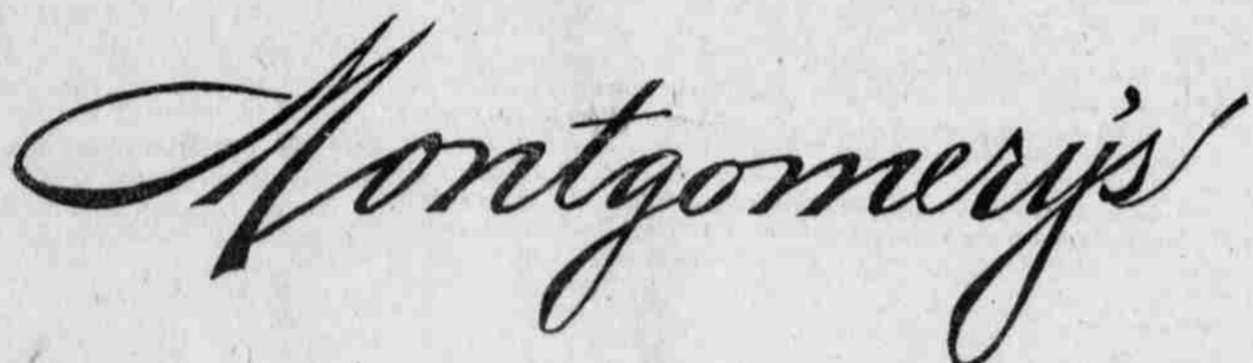

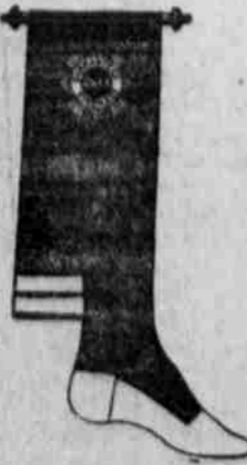
