BANK DEPOSITS SHOW NEARLY HALF MILLION GROWTH IN YEAR

CITY'S PROGRESS REFLECTED BY LOCAL BANKS

During Eleven Months Banks Have Gained \$463,021 in Deposits -Has Been Marvelous Growth.

Four hundred and sixty-three thousand and twenty-one dollars has been the gain made by local banking institutions in eleven months-nearly half a million of dollars. Such a growth is shown by the statements of the banks as called for at the close of business, November 16.

In no other way is the growth of the city better reflected. Since 1905, or in four years, deposits have increased from \$609,498 to \$1,717,510, or over a million of dollars. During the past year the growth has been far more rapid, for nearly as great gain has been made the past year as during the preceding three

All of the banks' statements show gratifying growth. No doubt but that deposits will increase as rapidly or more so in the future.


