

HERE'S CHANCE FOR FARMERS

O. A. C. Offers Short Courses in Different Lines Which Will Greatly Benefit Farmers Who Attend.

(Mail Tribune Special Service.) CORVALLIS, Ore., Nov. 19.—Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis: The winter short courses for general agriculture, dairying, horticulture, mechanic arts, domestic science and art, and commerce will open at this college on Tuesday, January 4th and will extend for six weeks. There will also be a one-week course in the above subjects, which opens Monday, February 14th, and is better known as "Farmer's Week."

The purpose of these courses is to accommodate those people who find it impossible to attend the regular four year course. Then there are also, no doubt, many mature farmers and housewives well past the usual school age, who desire to acquaint themselves more fully with the most recent developments in their respective lines of labor and to keep pace with the rapid development in the science, art, and practice of agriculture and home-making.

EDITOR OF NEW YORK SUN DIES SUDDENLY

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—William M. Laffan, editor and publisher of the New York Sun, died at his home, the Laffan house, Lawrence, L. I., at 3:30 this morning, following an operation for appendicitis.

CITY NOTICES. Section 1. Whereas, the City Council did heretofore, by resolution, declare its intention to lay a four-inch water main on Mistletoe street to West Tenth street, from West Main street, and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property, and did fix a time and place for hearing protests against the laying of said water main on said portion of said street and the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid.

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ORDINANCE NO. 257. An ordinance declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a four-inch water main on Newtown street and directing the recorder to enter a statement thereon in the water main lien docket.

ORDINANCE NO. 255. An ordinance declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a four-inch water main on Mistletoe street, and directing the recorder to enter a statement thereon in the water main lien docket.

ORDINANCE NO. 253. An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$15,000 of the Improvement Bonds of the City of Medford, Jackson County, Oregon, and directing the advertising of the same for sale in accordance with Chapter V of Title XXVII of Ballinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of the State of Oregon.

ORDINANCE NO. 252. Section 1. Whereas, the City of Medford has heretofore duly caused to be laid in certain streets of said city and has duly assessed the cost thereof to the property benefited thereby in accordance with the charter of said city; and whereas, certain owners of sundry pieces of property, each assessed for such improvement in a sum exceeding \$25, have duly made and filed applications to pay said several assessments in installments in accordance with Section 2727 of said Ballinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes, and whereas, as assessment and bond lien docket has been duly made up in accordance with the provisions of said section and with Section 2728 of said Codes and Statutes, and the total amount of unpaid assessments for such street improvements and for which application to pay under the provisions of said section above cited has been made and filed as aforesaid, is the sum of \$15,000.00, as shown by said bond lien docket:

Section 2. The recorder of the city of Medford is hereby directed to enter a statement of said several assessments in the Water Main Lien Docket.

Section 3. Each of said bonds shall have attached thereto twenty coupons, each of which shall be in the following form:
