

ROLLER TAKES ON JIM'S OLD BOXER

Says He Will Quit Wrestling Game for Ring—Tommy Ryan Will Train Him.

(United Press Licensed Wire.) SEATTLE, Wash., Nov. 29.—Dr. R. P. Roller, wrestler-physician, who has achieved considerable local newspaper notoriety of an unenviable character, has reconsidered his decision to devote the winter to wrestling and has resurrected his old ambition to become a pugilist. According to an announcement following, Tommy Ryan, the veteran middle-weight boxer, has taken Dr. Roller under his tutelage and declares that the Seattle physician has the making of a fighter. Roller, who is at present at Mount Clemens, Mich., intends, he says, to devote himself to the ring game exclusively, after the Christmas holidays, and he will have Ryan as a steady boxing partner. After several months of preparation, Roller will be matched with one of the second-rate heavy-weight scrappers for a try-out.

BOB BURDETTE SAYS GOOD-BYE TO HIS FLOCK

RESOLUTION AND CHARTER AMENDMENT

Be it resolved, by the city council of the city of Medford:

Section 1. That there is hereby proposed to be submitted to the legal voters of the city of Medford for approval or rejection the following proposed amendment to the charter of said city, to-wit:

A charter amendment to the charter of the city of Medford, Oregon, amending subsection 42 of section 25 and section 100 of said charter giving the time for which contracts may be entered into and franchises be granted by said city.

The people of the city of Medford do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That subsection 42 of section 25 of the charter of Medford be amended so as to read as follows:

42. No franchise or contract shall be granted by the city or city council for a longer period than ten years, except street railway franchises, which may be granted for such period as the council or legal voters of said city may see fit.

Section 2. That section 100 of the charter of said city be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 100. No contract shall be entered into by the city, or any franchise granted by it, for a longer period than ten years, except franchises for street railways, which may be granted for such periods as the city council or voters of said city may see fit. No franchise shall grant any exclusive right or rights.

Section 2. Be it further resolved, that said charter amendment be so proposed and submitted to the voters of said city as aforesaid at a special election called and to be held in said city on the 14th day of December, 1909, and that the recorder of said city cause said proposed charter amendment to be printed, published and posted in conformity with ordinance No. 124 of said city.
