PRECOOLING OF FRUIT A SUCCESS

Experiments Conducted in Iowa Show Best Results—May Be Generally Adopted.

Experiments at the Iowa experiment station have thoroughly demonstrated that partly colored fruit does not have as good keeping qualities as hard, ripe, highly colored fruit.

Any delay between harvesting and storing is at the expense of the keeping quality of the fruit. The extent of this loss depends upon several things.
