

FROZEN DURING RECENT STORM

Man Found Dead on Hillside Near Tolo Was Said to Be Very Heavy Drinker.

The dead body of Joseph Kampbell, single, 37 years old, was recently found in an open field on the old McDonough place, adjoining Tolo, by Col. Ray's employes. It was apparent that life had been extinct several days. The body lay on a side hill and it is thought that as Kampbell fell he must have been stunned, and strangled in the snow before he could regain consciousness.

Coroner A. E. Kellogg was summoned from Gold Hill, but upon viewing the remains and hearing the circumstances preceding Kampbell's death, decided that an inquest was unnecessary.

Kampbell came to this district from Philadelphia six years ago. Several of his acquaintances have heard him speak of a sister living in Pennsylvania, the only relative he was known to have, he being a native of Germany.
