



First-The account sales do not always give the actual price received, nor do they tell where such fruit was sold. In other words, the statements sent out to the producer are false as to price and destination.

Second-the condition of the fruit on arrival at destination is often misrepresented so as to further lower tory. the price to the grower.

Third-Rebating is practiced so as to secure a certain few growers who may be representative, and by this means other growers sell'at the low figure offered. The growers who enter into this nefarious contract with certain shippers act their part by showing satisfaction with prevailing low prices. At the end of the season it the shipper pays the rebate to these confederates in cash.




