MANAGUA, Nicagragua, Jan. 1 .-The feeling here that the revolutionists are planning simultaneous attacks upon Greytown and Acopapi today has assumed almost the proportions of a certainty.

Following General Estrada's announcement that he would refuse to recognize Madriz as president and the delivery of his ultimatum containing alternative propositions for the selection of a chief executive, Madriz supporters are convinced that the insurgent leader is planning an attack uopn one of the government strong-
