EUROPE IS AFTER OREGON APPLES

Big Foreign Market Beckons to Orchardists of Oregon—Very Large Trade During Year 1909.

A recent consular bulletin covers the apple and fruit markets of those foreign countries in which the United States is most interested. By this bulletin it is proved that a big market for good fruit exists abroad, but that the United States has not yet gone after it seriously. The figures suggest the tremendous possibilities for Oregon, when this state is able to produce large quantities of high-class fruit.

Montreal, Canada, has shipped this season 581,200 barrels of apples, almost entirely to England. These apples were grown in the province of Quebec, and a small portion of Ontario contiguous to Quebec. The shipments for the year closed were 230,000 barrels greater than in 1908, but in 1907 the shipments aggregated 629,566 barrels.

Liverpool during 1908 imported 1,429,751 hundredweight of apples, worth \$3,865,464, which was a decrease from the 1907 record of 249,262 hundredweight. This year Liverpool imported from the United States 66,280 barrels and 29,610 boxes of apples, which quantity reduced to the barrel measurement makes a total of about 76,150 barrels. During the same period Liverpool imported from Canada 183,447 barrels, showing that the northern orchards of Britain, although producing nothing compared to the Oregon fruit, is in a big lead so far as getting business goes. London, Glasgow, Leith and Manchester are among the very heaviest consumers of this imported fruit, so that the Liverpool reports indicate only a small portion of the business.

Germany Heavy Importer.

Germany imports about \$11,900,000 in fruit annually, of which three-fifths is for fresh fruit, and two-fifths for preserved or dried fruit. The total annual production of all fruits, including berries in Germany is about \$59,000,000. About one-half of the imports into that nation are apples, of which the United States ships a large portion. This market is regarded a much broader one than present sales indicate, if all features of the demand are studied. In 1900 Germany's stand of fruit trees was as follows: Apples, 52,332,000 trees; pears, 25,116,000 trees; plums, 69,436,000, and cherries, 21,548,000.

Great Britain is endeavoring to encourage her colonies to supply her fruit imports. Australia, New Zealand and Canada are now shipping heavy consignments of fruit to the mother country. Some of the colonial districts, especially portions of Canada, make fruit exhibits at the English country fairs, with the double purpose of advertising a fruit offered for sale, and also to encourage the rural population to migrate to the colonies. American consuls encourage Pacific fruit men to make such exhibits at some of the British fairs, as there is prospect of increasing the sale of the peerless Oregon and Washington product thereby.

Secure Reduced Rates.

Recently a reduced rate was secured for shipment of South African fruit to Birmingham and other British cities, the rates to go into effect January 1 of this year. A considerable freight reduction on Cape fruit was made by the Railway Clearing House of the United Kingdom, after protracted negotiations with the Cape Trades Commission. Railway charges in marketing the South African fruit have been held the most serious detriment in getting it to the English consumer, but under the new regime it is expected that every encouragement will be afforded the Cape orchardists, and that there will be a big development of the business. This development will be of especial interest to the Oregon fruit men, whose superior grades of fruit are carving out a big market in England, and may even suggest that a close study must be made all of the time of transportation conditions, that other producers are not given any marked advantage over those of this coast.

ELECTION OFFICERS TO BE CHOSEN IN JUNE

SALEM, Or., Jan. 7.—Attorney General Crawford today rendered an opinion to the effect that the county courts of the several counties shall make their appointments of election officers for the general election to be held this year, November 8, at the June term of the county courts. Heretofore, the appointment of clerks and judges of the general election were made in January for the June election.

An act was adopted by the people in June, 1908, amending the constitution and changing the time of holding the general elections from June to November, and the act specifies that all preparations for the general election will take place at the same period of time prior to the November election as it did heretofore before the June election which, in the opinion of the attorney general, makes the appointment of election officials come in June instead of January. The opinion was rendered at the request of County Judge C. H. Gardner of Lincoln county.
